March for Life in Washington, DC

Every year since 1974, the March for Life has taken place in Washington, DC. This year was special as, for the first time ever, a sitting President of the Unites States came and addressed all of us. If you missed it, you can hear the speech of President Donald Trump on Youtube.

Representatives from ZOE for Life!®, Orthodox Christians for Life, seminarians and Orthodox Christians from around the country were there. His Beautitude TIKHON, Primate of the Orthodox Church of America, invited us all to a hierarchical Diving Liturgy which was held at St. Nicholas Cathedral in Washington. He was joined there by Bishop Apostolos, of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese (who offered the opening prayer at the March), Bishop David of Alaska, from the OCA,

Archbishop Melchisedek of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, from the OCA, Archbishop Michael of New York, of the OCA, Bishop Paul of Chicago, of the OCA, Bishop Daniel Diocese of the West, of the OCA., and Bishop Thomas of Charleston, of the Antiochian Archdiocese. We met His Eminence, Archbishop Daniel of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, when we converged at the Mall. Our beloved Hierarchs offered special prayers of supplication for the Orthodox Christians gathered there, before we began the march to the steps of the Supreme Court.

Next year the March will take place on January 29th. Come with us!

How ZOE for Life!® Began

On a warm sunny day in 1998, a group of Orthodox church friends sat on a porch in deep conversation. They discussed how the Lord had blessed each one of them and how they would like to serve Him in some way. As a result, a survey was sent to female parishioners at Saints Constantine and Helen Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Cleveland Heights, OH, to see what they felt was the greatest social need, and where they would like to get involved and make a difference. The survey revealed three major areas of interest: battered women and children, an Orthodox adoption agency, and women in distress due to unplanned pregnancies.

After meeting with representatives of the Ohio Department of Health and Family Services, executive directors of crisis pregnancy centers and representatives from Care Net, a national Christian organization that fosters crisis pregnancy centers, they were stunned to learn that the Orthodox community very likely suffers higher abortion rates than the national norm. Clergy sadly confirmed this, stating that women in crisis due to unplanned pregnancies only discussed this during confession.

These conversations galvanized the friends as nothing else had. They began meeting in earnest to create and develop an organization that catered to this urgent need. So, ZOE for Life!® (which means 'life' in Greek) was born.

ZOE for Life!® won the important endorsement of the Standing Conference of the Canonical Orthodox Bishops in the Americas (SCOBA), the predecessor to the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the United States of America in 2003.

In the summer of 2006, ZOE for Life!® opened the doors to ZOE House - its first community outreach center serving the northeast Ohio area. It helps women who have chosen life but are struggling to provide daily necessities for their newborn and serves as a place for support and counseling. ZOE House also serves as a repository for physical necessities including maternity clothing, diapers, wipes, pack and plays, car seats and clothing for newborns and toddlers. In 2019, ZOE House served 600 families, 300 of them being new clients.

The ministry these friends thought of on a porch many years ago continues to grow.

Since then, ZOE for Life!® opened its first chapters. Detroit, MI in August 2015 which was subsequently moved to Ann Arbor, MI in November 2018.

In 2019, ZOE Women's Center[™] opened. ZOE Women's Center[™] offers women pregnancy testing, confirmation of pregnancy viability via limited obstetrical ultrasounds, health information, adoption referrals, post-abortion and sexual healing groups and support in an unplanned pregnancy.

ZOE for Life!® Binghamton Chapter

Plans are proceeding for the formation of the ZOE for Life!® Southern Tier chapter. Lay people and clergy from parishes along New York State's Southern Tier-Binghamton, Johnson City, Vestal, Endicott, Ithaca, Lansing, and Elmira Heights--have formed a steering committee that has been meeting to write bylaws and begin the process of filing the necessary paperwork for incorporation and obtaining 501(c)(3) status. The members have contacted and visited existing local crisis pregnancy organizations to gather information regarding the need for services in the area. The committee has decided to forge ahead with establishing the chapter while we continue to discuss and pray about our focus.

In November we received good news from the National Jr. ACRY, the philanthropic group of

the American Carpatho-Russian Orthodox Diocese of the U.S.A. The group provides opportunities for youth ages 8-18 to live their faith in action and be connected to other Orthodox youth from across the diocese. Every year they organize a National Jr. ACRY Lenten Mission Project where all chapters raise funds for a common cause. At its recent convention last Labor Day weekend, the National Jr. ACRY decided that this Great Lent they will be supporting the new ZOE for Life!® Southern Tier chapter.
